SUMMARY NOTICE

Statement of Plaintiff Recovery

Lead Plaintiff The Harr Family, comprised of Eric and Bryan Harr, and Plaintiff Thomas DiLorenzo (collectively, “Plaintiffs”), on behalf of themselves and the Settlement Class have entered into a proposed Settlement with all Defendants that, if approved by the Court, will resolve this Action in its entirety.

A settlement fund of \$3,400,000.00 in cash, plus interest (“Gross Settlement Fund”), is being established for the benefit of the Settlement Class described herein.

The estimated average recovery per allegedly damaged share of Ampio common stock under the Settlement is \$0.117 for the approximately 29 million shares of Ampio common stock allegedly damaged during the Class Period. A share may have been traded more than once during the Class Period. This estimate solely reflects the average recovery per damaged share of Ampio common stock. The indicated average recovery per share will be the total average recovery for all purchases of that share. This is not an estimate of the actual recovery per share you should expect. Your actual recovery will depend on the aggregate losses of all Settlement Class Members, the date(s) you purchased and sold Ampio stock and the total number and amount of claims filed. If not all Settlement Class Members submit claims, your actual recovery could be more than the estimated average amount.

Lead Counsel will make an application to the Court for an award of attorneys’ fees from the Gross Settlement Fund in connection with this Settlement. It is expected that the application will seek the sum of approximately \$850,000, which constitutes approximately 25% of the Gross Settlement Fund, plus interest earned at the same rate as the Gross Settlement Fund.

The attorneys representing Plaintiffs and the Settlement Class have expended considerable time and effort in prosecuting this litigation on a contingent-fee basis, and have advanced all of the expenses of the litigation, with the expectation that if they were successful in obtaining a recovery for the Settlement Class, they would be paid from such recovery. In this type of litigation, it is customary for the plaintiff’s counsel to be awarded a percentage of the common fund recovery as their attorneys’ fees.

Lead Counsel will also apply for reimbursement of out-of-pocket costs and expenses incurred in prosecuting the Settlement Class’ claims, including the fees of Plaintiffs’ experts and consultants, for a total of no greater than \$100,000, plus interest earned at the same rate as the Gross Settlement Fund. In addition, Plaintiffs will

apply for an Award to Plaintiffs of no more than \$15,000.00 (\$5,000 each) for reimbursement for their reasonable costs and expenses (including lost wages) directly related to their representation of the Settlement Class.

If approved by the Court, these amounts will be paid from the Gross Settlement Fund. If the above amounts are requested and approved by the Court, the average cost per share of damaged common stock will be approximately \$0.0332 per share, making the estimated recovery per damaged share after deduction of the requested attorneys' fees and expenses and Award to Plaintiff, \$0.0838 per share.

The average recovery also assumes that all Settlement Class Members receive and cash their distribution checks. If not all Settlement Class Members cash their distribution checks and a second distribution becomes necessary, your actual recovery could be more than the estimated average amount. Additionally, a Settlement Class Member's actual recovery will be determined by the Plan of Allocation of the Net Settlement Fund described below, and will depend upon, among other things, when during the Settlement Class Period a Settlement Class Member purchased Ampio stock, and when and if such stock was sold. Under one or more of these factors, individual Settlement Class Members could receive more or less than the estimated average per-share amount.

Statement of Potential Outcome of Case

Plaintiffs and Defendants disagree about both liability and damages and do not agree on the average amount of damages per share, if any, that would be recoverable if Plaintiffs were to have prevailed on each claim alleged. Among the many key issues about which Plaintiffs and Defendants disagree are: (i) whether Defendants violated the securities laws or otherwise engaged in any wrongdoing; (ii) the extent (if any) that the alleged misrepresentations and omissions influenced the trading prices of Ampio common stock during the Settlement Class Period; and (iii) the method for determining whether, and the extent to which (if any), purchasers of Ampio stock suffered injury and damages that could be recovered at trial.

Defendants deny that they are liable to the Plaintiffs or the Settlement Class and deny that Plaintiffs or the Settlement Class have suffered any recoverable damages whatsoever.

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Reasons for the Settlement

Plaintiffs, along with Lead Counsel, who has extensive experience in class action litigation, agreed to the Settlement after considering, among other things: (a) the substantial cash benefits to Settlement Class Members of the Settlement; (b) the desirability of consummating the Stipulation in order to provide certain and effective relief to Settlement Class Members at this juncture of the Action and without further delay; (c) the uncertainty of being able adequately to state a claim and ultimately prove the allegations in the Complaint; (d) Defendants' likely positions, expressed during the pendency of the litigation and also in connection with settlement negotiations, concerning the various liability, causation, and damages issues; (e) the attendant risks of litigation, especially in complex actions such as this, as well as the difficulties and

delays inherent in such litigation (including any appeals); and (f) Plaintiffs' and Lead Counsel's belief that the Settlement is fair, reasonable, and adequate and in the best interests of all Settlement Class Members.

For Defendants, who deny all allegations of wrongdoing or liability whatsoever, the principal reasons for entering into the Settlement are to bring to an end the substantial expenses, burdens, risks, and uncertainties associated with continued litigation of this Action; to finally put to rest those claims and the underlying matters; and to avoid further expense and disruption to the management and operation of the corporate Defendant's business due to the prosecution and defense of this Action.

WHAT THIS NOTICE CONTAINS

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BASIC INFORMATION

1. Why did I get this notice package?

The Court authorized this Notice to be sent to you because records show that between January 13, 2014 and August 21, 2014, you may have purchased Ampio common stock.

If this description applies to you, you have a right to know about the proposed Settlement of this class action lawsuit, and about all of your options, before the Court decides whether to approve the Settlement. If the Court approves the Settlement, and after any objections and appeals are resolved, an administrator appointed by the Court will make the payments that the Settlement allows.

This Notice explains the lawsuit, the Settlement, Settlement Class Members' legal rights, what benefits are available, who is eligible for them, and how to get them.

The Court in charge of this Action is the United States District Court for the Central District of California, in Los Angeles, California, and the case is known as Harr v. Ampio Pharmaceuticals, Inc., et. al., Case No. 2:15-cv-03474-TJH-PJW (C.D. Cal.). The Action is assigned to and overseen by the Honorable Terry J. Hatter, Jr., United States District Judge.

The individuals that are suing, namely Eric Harr and Bryan Harr (collectively "the Harr Family" or "Lead Plaintiff") and Thomas DiLorenzo, are called "Plaintiffs." The company and persons being sued, namely Ampio, Michael Macaluso, Mark D. McGregor, Gregory A. Gould and Vaughan L. Clift, are called the Defendants.

2. What is this lawsuit about?

Plaintiffs claim that Defendants violated federal securities laws by misrepresenting and/or omitting information regarding the STEP Study for Ampion – a biologic in development by Ampio intended to alleviate osteoarthritis in the knee. The Complaint asserts unspecified damages and asserts claims against Defendants under Sections 10(b) and 20(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Rule 10b-5 promulgated thereunder, and Sections 11 and 15 of the Securities Act of 1933. Defendants vigorously deny the allegations of wrongdoing and any liability whatsoever. The Court has made no decision regarding the merits of the claims.

3. Why is this a class action?

In a class action, one or more persons or entities sue on behalf of people who have similar claims. All these people are referred to as a class, and each is a class member. Bringing a case, such as this one, as a class action allows the adjudication of many similar claims of persons and entities that might be economically too small to bring as individual actions. One court resolves the issues for all Settlement Class Members at the same time, except for those who properly exclude themselves from the Settlement Class.

4. Why is there a settlement?

On May 8, 2015 and May 14, 2015, purported stockholders of the Company brought two putative class action lawsuits in the United States District Court for the Central District of California, titled Napoli v. Ampio Pharmaceuticals, Inc., et al., Case No. 2:15-cv-03474-TJH and Stein v. Ampio Pharmaceuticals, Inc., et al., Case No. 2:15-cv-03640-TJH. On December 10, 2015, the Court consolidated these cases into the instant action, now titled Harr v. Ampio Pharmaceuticals, Inc., et al., Case No. 2:15-cv-03474-TJH-PJW, appointed the Harr Family as lead plaintiff, and appointed Laurence Rosen, of The Rosen Law Firm, P.A., as lead counsel.

Plaintiffs filed a Consolidated Amended Class Action Complaint for Violations of the Federal Securities Laws on February 8, 2016 (the "CAC") on behalf of purchasers of Ampio common stock between January

13, 2014 through August 21, 2014, inclusive (the “Settlement Class Period”), which named Ampio, Michael Macaluso, Mark D. McGregor, Gregory A. Gould, and Vaughan L. Clift as defendants.

On August 4, 2016, the Court issued an order granting Defendants’ motion to dismiss the CAC, with leave to amend. On or around August 16, 2016, the Parties conferred regarding the possibility of settlement and a mediation to facilitate resolution of the case. Pursuant to a stipulation, on September 6, 2016, the Court entered an Order to extend the date for Plaintiffs to file a second amended complaint until September 27, 2016, and to extend the date for Defendants to respond to that complaint until November 11, 2016.

On September 27, 2016, Plaintiffs filed their Second Consolidated Amended Class Action Complaint for Violations of the Federal Securities Laws (the “Complaint” or “SAC”), against the same Defendants on behalf of purchasers of Ampio common stock during the same Settlement Class Period. The SAC is the operative complaint in this Action and alleges that Defendants violated federal securities laws by misrepresenting and/or omitting information regarding the STEP Study for Ampion – a biologic in development by Ampio intended to alleviate osteoarthritis in the knee. The SAC seeks an unspecified amount of damages and asserts claims against Defendants under Sections 10(b) and 20(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Rule 10b-5 promulgated thereunder, and Sections 11 and 15 of the Securities Act of 1933.

On November 1, 2016, the Court entered an Order further extending the date for Defendants to respond to the Complaint until December 12, 2016. The Parties had requested such an extension in order to complete mediation.

On November 8, 2016, the parties participated in an all-day mediation session before Michelle Yoshida of Phillips ADR in which they laid out their current factual and legal positions in the case, and discussed the strengths and weaknesses of their positions. Prior to the mediation, the Parties exchanged mediation statements. Plaintiffs and Defendants reached an agreement-in-principle to settle this matter during the November 8, 2016 mediation. The Parties then negotiated and executed a Memorandum of Understanding, dated November 17, 2016, that outlined and confirmed many of the material terms of the agreement. The Parties subsequently negotiated the terms of the Stipulation, which was filed with the Court on January 31, 2017.

Thus, the Court did not finally decide in favor of Plaintiffs or Defendants, who continue to deny liability. Instead, both sides formally agreed to a settlement. By settling, the parties avoid the risks, uncertainty and additional costs of a trial, and the affected Settlement Class Members may receive compensation. Plaintiffs and Lead Counsel believe the Settlement is best for all Settlement Class Members.

WHO IS IN THE SETTLEMENT

To see if you may get money from this Settlement, you first have to determine whether you are a Settlement Class Member.

5. How do I know if I am part of the Settlement?

The Court decided that everyone who fits this description is a Settlement Class Member:

All Persons who purchased Ampio common stock during the period from and including January 13, 2014 to August 21, 2014, including those who purchased Ampio common stock pursuant and/or traceable to the Company’s secondary public offering on or about February 28, 2014.

If you are part of the Settlement Class, you are a Settlement Class Member and part of the Settlement unless one of the exceptions described in the answer to question 6 below apply to you.

6. Are there exceptions to being included?

Yes. You are not a Settlement Class Member if you are a Defendant in the Action; a member of the immediate family of any Individual Defendant, a present or former officer or director of Ampio, or the legal

representative, heir, successor or assign of any of the foregoing, or you are an entity in which Defendants have or had a controlling interest.

Additionally, anyone who submits a valid and timely request for exclusion from the Settlement Class, in accordance with the procedures set forth in question 13, is not considered a Settlement Class Member and cannot participate in the Settlement.

7. What if I am still not sure if I am included?

If you are still not sure whether you are included in the Settlement, you can ask for free help. THE SETTLEMENT BENEFITS — WHAT DOES THE SETTLEMENT PROVIDE?

8. What is the Settlement Fund?

In exchange for the Settlement and dismissal of the action, Defendants have agreed to create a Three Million Four Hundred Thousand Dollar (\$3,400,000.00) settlement fund to be distributed, after various Court-approved fees and expenses, among all Settlement Class Members who submit valid claims.

9. How much will my payment be?

You can calculate your recovery in accordance with the formulas shown below in the Plan of Allocation of the Net Settlement Fund. Your share of the Net Settlement Fund will or may depend on: (i) the number of claims filed; (ii) the dates you purchased and sold Ampio common stock; (iii) the prices of your purchases and sales; (iv) the amount of administrative costs, including the costs of notice; (v) the amount awarded by the Court to Lead Counsel for attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses; and (vi) the awards to Plaintiffs.

The Claims Administrator will determine each Authorized Claimant's *pro rata* share of the Net Settlement Fund based upon each Authorized Claimant's valid "Recognized Claim." The Recognized Claim formula is not intended to be an estimate of the amount that a Settlement Class Member might have been able to recover after a trial; it also is not an estimate of the amount that will be paid to Authorized Claimants pursuant to the Settlement. The Recognized Claim formula is the basis upon which the Net Settlement Fund will be proportionately allocated to the Authorized Claimants.

The Net Settlement Fund will be distributed to Class Members who submit valid, timely claim forms ("Authorized Claimants") under the below Plan of Allocation, which reflects Plaintiffs' contention that because of the alleged misrepresentations and omissions made by Defendants, the price of Ampio common stock was artificially inflated during the Settlement Class Period and that disclosures and materialization of the true facts caused changes in the inflated stock price.

The Recognized Claim, or compensable loss per share, of each Authorized Claimant shall be calculated according to the proposed Plan of Allocation of the Net Settlement Fund set forth below.

PROPOSED PLAN OF ALLOCATION OF THE NET SETTLEMENT FUND

The Plan of Allocation is a matter separate and apart from the proposed Settlement, and any decision by the Court concerning the Plan of Allocation shall not affect the validity or finality of the proposed Settlement. The Court may approve the Plan of Allocation with or without modifications agreed to among the Parties, or another plan of allocation, without further notice to Settlement Class Members. Any orders regarding a modification of the Plan of Allocation will be posted to the Claims Administrator's website, www.strategicclaims.net.

The Claims Administrator shall determine each Authorized Claimant's *pro rata* share of the Net Settlement Fund based upon each Authorized Claimant's Recognized Claim. **Please Note:** The Recognized

Claim formula, set forth below, is not intended to be an estimate of the amount of what a Settlement Class Member might have been able to recover after a trial, nor is it an estimate of the amount that will be paid to Authorized Claimants pursuant to the Settlement. The Recognized Claim formula is the basis upon which the Net Settlement Fund will be proportionately allocated to the Authorized Claimants. To the extent there are sufficient funds in the Net Settlement Fund, each Authorized Claimant will receive an amount equal to the Authorized Claimant's Recognized Claim. If, however, the amount in the Net Settlement Fund is not sufficient to permit payment of the total Recognized Claim of each Authorized Claimant, then each Authorized Claimant shall be paid the percentage of the Net Settlement Fund that each Authorized Claimant's Recognized Claim bears to the total Recognized Claims of all Authorized Claimants (*i.e.*, "*pro rata share*"). Payment in this manner shall be deemed conclusive against all Authorized Claimants. No distribution will be made on a claim where the potential distribution amount is less than ten dollars (\$10.00) in cash.

If any funds remain in the Net Settlement Fund by reason of uncashed checks, or otherwise, after the Claims Administrator has made reasonable and diligent efforts to have Authorized Claimants who are entitled to participate in the distribution of the Net Settlement Fund cash their distribution checks, then any balance remaining in the Net Settlement Fund six (6) months after the initial distribution of such funds shall be used: (i) first, to pay any amounts mistakenly omitted from the initial distribution to Authorized Claimants or to pay any late, but otherwise valid and fully documented claims received after the cut-off date used to make the initial distribution, provided that such distributions to any late post-distribution claimants meet all of the other criteria for inclusion in the initial distribution, including the \$10.00 minimum check amount set forth in the Notice; (ii) second, to pay any additional Notice and Administration Costs incurred in administering the Settlement; and (iii) finally, to make a second distribution to Authorized Claimants who cashed their checks from the initial distribution and who would receive at least \$10.00 from such second distribution, after payment of the estimated costs or fees to be incurred in administering the Net Settlement Fund and in making this second distribution, if such second distribution is economically feasible. If six (6) months after such second distribution, if undertaken, or if such second distribution is not undertaken, any funds shall remain in the Net Settlement Fund after the Claims Administrator has made reasonable and diligent efforts to have Authorized Claimants who are entitled to participate in this Settlement cash their checks, any funds remaining in the Net Settlement Fund shall be donated to a non-profit charitable organization(s) selected by Lead Counsel.

THE BASIS FOR CALCULATING YOUR RECOGNIZED CLAIM:

Each Authorized Claimant shall be allocated a *pro rata* share of the Net Settlement Fund based on his, her or its Recognized Claim as compared to the total Recognized Claims of all Authorized Claimants. Recognized Claims will be calculated as follows:

(I) Recognized Claim Calculation for Common Stock Purchased (excluding Common Stock purchased pursuant and/or traceable to the Secondary Public Offering on or about February 28, 2014) during the Class Period:

1. For shares of common stock purchased between January 13, 2014 and August 20, 2014, inclusive:

A. For shares retained at the end of trading on November 19, 2014¹, the Recognized Claim shall be the lesser of:

- (1) \$1.80 per share; or
- (2) the difference between the purchase price per share and \$3.78.²

¹ This is the end of the 90 Day Lookback Period, as defined in footnote 2 below.

² Pursuant to Section 21(D)(e)(1) of the Private Securities Litigation Reform Act of 1995, "in any private action arising under this title in which the plaintiff seeks to establish damages by reference to the market price of a security, the award of damages to the plaintiff shall not exceed the difference between the

- B. For shares sold between January 13, 2014 and August 20, 2014, inclusive, the Recognized Claim shall be zero.
- C. For shares sold on August 21, 2014, the Recognized Claim shall be the lesser of:
- (1) \$1.80 per share; or
 - (2) the difference between the purchase price per share and the sales price per share for each share sold.
- D. For shares sold between August 22, 2014 and November 19, 2014, the Recognized Claim shall be the lesser of:
- (1) \$1.80 per share; or
 - (2) the difference between the purchase price per share and the average “90-Day Lookback Value” on the date of sale as provided in Table A below.
- 2. For shares of common stock purchased on August 21, 2014, the Recognized Claims shall be zero.**

(II) Calculation of Recognized Claim for Common Stock purchased pursuant and/or traceable to the Secondary Public Offering on or about February 28, 2014:

1. For shares of Ampio Common Stock purchased pursuant and/or traceable to the Secondary Public Offering on or about February 28, 2014, the Recognized Claim shall be calculated as follows:
 - A. For shares sold between February 28, 2014 and August 20, 2014, inclusive, the Recognized Claim shall zero.
 - B. For shares sold between August 21, 2014 and May 7, 2015³, inclusive, the Recognized Claim shall be the lesser of:
 - (1) \$1.80 per share; or
 - (2) \$7.00 per share (the offer price) less the sale price.
 - C. For shares held as of the opening of trading on May 8, 2015⁴, the Recognized Claim shall be \$1.80 per share.

To the extent a claimant had a trading gain or “broke even” from his, her or its overall transactions in Ampio shares during the Class Period, the value of the Recognized Claim will be zero and the claimant will not be entitled to a share of the Net Settlement Fund. To the extent that a claimant suffered a trading loss on his, her or its overall transactions in Ampio shares during the Class Period, but that trading loss was less than the Recognized Claim calculated above, then the Recognized Claim shall be limited to the amount of the claimant’s actual trading loss.

For purposes of calculating your Recognized Claim, the date of purchase or sale is the “contract” or “trade” date and not the “settlement” or “payment” date. The receipt or grant by gift, inheritance or operation of law of Ampio shares shall not be deemed a purchase, acquisition or sale of Ampio shares for the calculation of an Authorized Claimant’s Recognized Claim. The covering purchase of a short sale is not an eligible purchase for purposes of calculating Recognized Claims.

For purposes of calculating your Recognized Claim, all purchases and sales shall be matched on a First In First Out (“FIFO”) basis in chronological order. Therefore, on the Proof of Claim enclosed with this Notice, you must provide all of your purchases of Ampio shares during the time period from January 13, 2014 through and including May 7, 2015.

Payment pursuant to the Plan of Allocation approved by the Court shall be conclusive against all Authorized Claimants. No person shall have any claim against Defendants, Defendants’ Counsel, Lead

Plaintiffs, Lead Counsel or the Claims Administrator or other agent designated by Lead Counsel based on the distributions made substantially in accordance with the Stipulation and the Settlement contained therein, the Plan of Allocation, or further orders of the Court. Each claimant shall be deemed to have submitted to the jurisdiction of the Court with respect to the claimant's Claim Form. All persons involved in the review, verification, calculation, tabulation, or any other aspect of the processing of the claims submitted in connection with the Settlement, or otherwise involved in the administration or taxation of the Settlement Fund or the Net Settlement Fund shall be released and discharged from any and all claims arising out of such involvement, and all Settlement Class Members, whether or not they are to receive payment from the Net Settlement Fund, will be barred from making any further claim against the Net Settlement Fund beyond the amount allocated to them as provided in any distribution orders entered by the Court.

HOW YOU GET A PAYMENT — SUBMITTING A PROOF OF CLAIM FORM

10. How can I get a payment?

If you qualify as a Settlement Class Member, to be eligible for a settlement payment from the proceeds of the Settlement approved by the Court, you must send in the Proof of Claim and Release form enclosed with this Notice. You also may get a Proof of Claim and Release form on the internet at www.strategicclaims.net or by calling the Claims Administrator at 866-274-4004. Read the instructions carefully, fill out the form, include all the documents requested, sign the form, and send it by first-class mail, postmarked no later than July 5, 2017, to the Claims Administrator:

11. When will I get my payment?

The Court will hold a hearing on **August 28, 2017** to decide whether to approve the Settlement. If the Court approves the Settlement after that, there may be appeals. It is always uncertain how these appeals will be resolved, and resolving them can take a long time, perhaps more than a year. It also takes a long time, often many months, for all distributions to be accurately reviewed and processed. Please be patient.

12. What am I giving up to get a payment or stay in the Settlement Class?

Unless you exclude yourself from the Settlement Class by the August 7, 2017 deadline, you will be a member of the Settlement Class and will be bound by the release of claims if the Settlement is approved. That means you and all other Settlement Class Members, and each of your respective personal representatives, immediate family, trustees, heirs, executors, administrators, parent entities, associates, affiliates, predecessors, successors and assigns, and any other person or entity claiming to be acting on behalf of any of you, will release (agreeing never to sue, continue to sue, or be part of any other lawsuit) any claims which arise out of, are based upon or relate in any way to the purchase or sale of Ampio common stock during the Settlement Class Period. It means that all of the Court's orders in the Action will apply to you and legally bind you. The specific terms of the release and related terms are included in the Stipulation.

If you remain a member of the Settlement Class, all of the Court's orders will apply to you and legally bind you.

EXCLUDING YOURSELF FROM THE SETTLEMENT

If you do not want a payment from this Settlement, but you want to keep any right you may have to sue or continue to sue Defendants and the other Released Persons, on your own, concerning the Released Claims,

then you must take steps to exclude yourself. This is called excluding yourself or “opting out” of the Settlement Class.

13. How do I exclude myself from the proposed Settlement?

To exclude yourself from the Settlement Class, you must mail a letter stating that you “request exclusion from the Settlement Class in Harr v. Ampio Pharmaceuticals, Inc.” You cannot exclude yourself by telephone or e-mail. Your letter must include your name, mailing address, daytime telephone number, e-mail address, and your signature. Your letter must also indicate the date(s), price(s) and number(s) of shares of Ampio common stock purchased and sold during the Settlement Class Period. No request for exclusion will be considered valid unless all of the information described above is included in any such request. You must mail your exclusion request by first-class mail, postmarked no later than August 7, 2017 to:

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If you ask to be excluded, you will not get any Settlement payment, and you cannot object to the Settlement. You will not be legally bound by anything that happens in this lawsuit, and you may be able to sue (or continue to sue) the Defendants and the other Released Persons in the future.

14. If I do not exclude myself, can I sue the Defendants and the other Released Persons for the same thing later?

No. Unless you properly exclude yourself, you give up any rights to sue Defendants and the other Released Persons for any and all Released Claims. If you do not exclude yourself, you will not be entitled to receive any recovery in any other action against any of the Released Persons based on or arising out of the Released Claims.

15. If I exclude myself, can I get money from the proposed Settlement?

No. If you exclude yourself, you will not receive any money from this Settlement. But, you may exercise any right you may have to sue, continue to sue, or be part of a different lawsuit against Defendants and the other Released Persons.

THE LAWYERS REPRESENTING YOU

16. Do I have a lawyer in this case?

The Court ordered that The Rosen Law Firm, P.A. will represent Plaintiffs and all Settlement Class Members. These lawyers are called Lead Counsel.

You will not be separately charged for these lawyers. The Court will determine the amount of Lead Counsel’s fees and expenses, which will be paid from the Gross Settlement Fund. If you want to be represented by your own lawyer, you may hire one at your own expense.

17. How will the lawyers be paid?

Lead Counsel will ask the Court to award attorneys’ fees from the Gross Settlement Fund of approximately \$850,000, or approximately 25% of the Gross Settlement Fund, plus interest on such fees at the same rate as earned by the Gross Settlement Fund. Lead Counsel will also seek reimbursement of expenses incurred by in

connection with the prosecution of this Action in an amount no greater than \$100,000 plus interest on such expenses at the same rate as earned by the Gross Settlement Fund.

Lead Counsel, without further notice to the Settlement Class, may subsequently apply to the Court for additional expenses incurred in connection with administering and distributing the settlement proceeds to the members of the Settlement Class and any proceedings subsequent to the Final Fairness Hearing.

The motion for attorneys' fees and expenses will be submitted on behalf of The Rosen Law Firm, P.A.

OBJECTING TO THE SETTLEMENT

You can tell the Court that you do not agree with the Settlement or some part of it.

18. How do I tell the Court that I do not like the proposed Settlement?

If you are a Settlement Class Member, you can object to the Settlement or any of its terms, the proposed Plan of Allocation of the Net Settlement Fund, and/or the application by Lead Counsel for an award of attorneys' fees and expenses. You may write to the Court setting out your objection. You may give reasons why you think the Court should not approve any or all of the Settlement terms. If you would like the Court to consider your views, you must file a proper objection within the deadline identified, and according to the following procedures.

To object, you must send a signed letter stating that you object to the proposed Settlement, Plan of Allocation or application for an award of attorneys' fees and expenses in Harr v. Ampio Pharmaceuticals, Inc., et al., Case No. 2:15-cv-03474 (C.D. Cal.). Be sure to include your name, address, daytime telephone number, e-mail address, and your signature, identify and supply documentation showing your purchases and sales of Ampio common stock during the Settlement Class Period, and state the reasons why you object to the Settlement, including all legal support you wish to bring to the Court's attention and any evidence you have to support your objection. Your objection must be filed with the Court and mailed or delivered to the following counsel at all of the following addresses, so that it is received no later than August 7, 2017:

You do not need to go to the Final Fairness Hearing to have your written objection considered by the Court. Any Settlement Class Member who has not previously submitted a request for exclusion from the Settlement Class and who has complied with the objection procedures set out in this question 18 may also appear at the Final Fairness Hearing and be heard, to the extent allowed by the Court, to state his, her or its objection to the Settlement, the Plan of Allocation, or Lead Counsel's motion for an award of attorneys' fees and reimbursement of expenses. Any such objector may appear in person or arrange, at his or her own expense, for a lawyer to represent him or her at the Final Fairness Hearing.

19. What is the difference between objecting and excluding?

Objecting is telling the Court that you do not like something about the proposed Settlement. You can object only if you stay in the Settlement Class and follow the objection procedures described above. Excluding yourself is telling the Court that you do not want to be part of the Settlement Class. If you exclude yourself, you have no basis to object because the case no longer affects you.

THE FINAL FAIRNESS HEARING

The Court will hold a hearing, called a Final Fairness Hearing, to consider whether to approve the proposed Settlement. At or after the Final Fairness Hearing, the Court will also decide whether to approve the Plan of Allocation of the Net Settlement Fund and Lead Counsel's application for attorneys' fees and expenses and any award to Plaintiffs.

20. When and where will the Court decide whether to approve the proposed Settlement?

The Court will hold the Final Fairness Hearing on August 28, 2017, at 10:00 a.m., in Courtroom 9B at the United States District Court for the Central District of California, United States Courthouse, 350 W. 1st Street, 9th Floor, Los Angeles, California 90012.

At this hearing, the Court will consider whether the Settlement is fair, reasonable and adequate and should be approved, and will also consider the proposed Plan of Allocation and the application of Lead Counsel for attorneys' fees and reimbursement of expenses. The Court will take into consideration any written objections filed in accordance with the instructions at question 18. The Court may also decide how much to pay to Plaintiffs' lawyers for their fees and expenses. At or after the hearing, the Court will decide whether to approve the Settlement. We do not know how long these decisions will take.

Also at the hearing the Court will decide whether to approve the dismissal with prejudice of all claims against Defendants.

21. Do I have to come to the hearing?

No. Lead Counsel will answer any questions the Court may have. But, you are welcome to attend at your own expense. If you send an objection, you do not have to come to Court to discuss it. As long as you filed your written objection on time, the Court will consider it. You may also pay your own lawyer to attend, but it is not required. If you do hire your own lawyer, he or she must file and serve a Notice of Appearance in the manner described in the answer to question 22 below.

Please be aware that the Court may change the date or time of the Final Fairness Hearing without further notice to Settlement Class Members. If you or your attorney plan to come to the hearing, you should check with Lead Counsel before coming to be sure that the date or time has not changed.

Settlement Class Members do not need to appear at the hearing or take any other action to indicate their approval of the matters being considered at the hearing.

22. May I speak at the hearing?

You may speak at the Final Fairness Hearing if you are a Settlement Class Member and you filed an objection to the Settlement, the Plan of Allocation, and/or Lead Counsel's application for an award of attorneys' fees and expenses in the manner and the time period described in the answer to question 18 above. If you plan to have an attorney speak on your behalf at the Final Fairness Hearing, your attorney must, on or before August 7, 2017, file a Notice of Appearance in this Action with the Clerk of the Court and deliver a copy to Lead Counsel and Counsel for Defendants at the addresses listed in the answer to question 18 above.

If you or your attorney plan to attend the Final Fairness Hearing and present evidence at the hearing, your written objections (prepared and submitted in accordance with the answer to question 18 above) must

identify any witness you or your attorney may seek to call to testify, and must identify any documents or other exhibits you or your attorney may seek to introduce into evidence.

IF YOU DO NOTHING

23. What happens if I do nothing at all?

If you do nothing, you will get no money from this Settlement and you will be precluded from starting a lawsuit, continuing with a lawsuit, or being part of any other lawsuit against the Defendants and the other Released Persons concerning the Released Claims, ever again. To share in the Net Settlement Fund, you must submit a Proof of Claim form (see question 10). To start, continue or be a part of any other lawsuit against the Defendants and the other Released Persons concerning the Released Claims in this case, you must exclude yourself from the Settlement Class (see question 13).

GETTING MORE INFORMATION

24. Are there more details about the proposed Settlement?

This Notice summarizes the proposed Settlement. More details are in the Stipulation of Settlement dated January 31, 2017.
